

April 2008 Seminar

Snapshots from the sessions on Integral Education

We continue with our coverage of the academic sessions from the April seminar at SACAR. We focus this time on the various sessions organized under the theme of Integral Education on April 22 and 23, 2008.

Explorations in Integral Education – Chali Grinell from the Future School at Auroville shared several real-life examples of implementing the ideals and objectives of Integral Education. The presentation highlighted some of the practical aspects as well as the challenges of applying integral approaches to teaching and learning. teaching at SAICE & Auroville - some key challenges in the practice of Integral Education. This session involved much interaction with the audience.

Integral Education and Society – Jean-Yves Lung & Deepti Tewari culled insights from their years of experience in educational programmes at Auroville. Jean-Yves opened the presentation with some thoughts on 'Education for Changing Times.' The key points were elaborated upon by Deepti in her talk titled 'Education in Auroville: Past, Present and Future.



Integral Education at SAICE: Student & <u>Teacher Perspective</u> – Vikas Kothari, a former student and currently a teacher of physics and mathematics at SAICE, gave a general overview of how Integral Education is practiced at SAICE, and highlighted some defining educational experiences that shaped his attitudes as a student as well as a teacher.



A beautiful documentary giving a comprehensive picture about SAICE was also shown. This documentary was filmed as part of the 60th anniversary celebrations of SAICE and also incorporated interviews with students and teachers.

<u>Psychic Education</u> – Neeltje Huppes from Sri Aurobindo International Centre for Education (SAICE) shed some light on the role of the evolving soul or psychic in Integral Education, which is aimed at: care for the discovery of the soul, and equal attention to the development of the mental, affective and physicial instruments.



Participants also watched a video-lecture by Ananda Reddy on '<u>Fundamentals of Integral</u> <u>Education.</u>'

She highlighted and discussed with the help of reallife examples some of the advice given by the Mother and Sri Aurobindo on developing mental faculties such as observation, concentration, analysis, quietening the mind, controlling its movements, and harmonizing contradictions.



Group-deliberations on Integral Education

The two-day-section on Integral Education came to a conclusion with a group-activity in which the participants discussed among themselves the following four questions:

- 1. What are some of the basics required to apply Integral Education in schools outside of Ashram and Auroville?
- 2. What are some of the new insights you have gained about education?
- 3. What is the difference between some of the approaches being used in contemporary elite schools and Integral Education?
- 4. What have you learned about the application of ideals of Integral Education for individual integral human development in adults?







Each of the four groups took up one question and after the group deliberations presented the summary of their discussions. Lively and fruitful exchange of ideas and reflections followed the group presentations, making the learning experience more enriching for everyone.

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ASSOCIATION OF INTEGRAL EDUCATION SCHOOLS

After the success of the workshops on the 'Need for Integral Education' conducted at Deeksha High School, Hanamkonda, Warangal from April 28- May 3, 2008, the management of various schools at Warangal became interested in initiating some aspects of Integral Education at their schools. On their request, a two day seminar was held at Institute of Human Study (I.H.S.), Hyderabad on May 25-26, 2008.

Dr. Ananda Reddy Chairman of I.H.S. addressed the seminar. Various issues and challenges in the successful implementation of Integral Education in mainstream schools were discussed at length. After the deliberations, it was resolved to form an 'Association of Integral Educational Schools' (AIES). The following schools became the founder members of the Association:

FARMERS' CAMP AT CHAMPAK HILLS

Matridarshan Trust conducted a one-day Farmers' Camp at Champak Hills, Jangaon on May 18, 2008; about seventy farmers from the surrounding villages attended the camp. Agricultural scientists and experts in non-chemical fertilizers and pesticides addressed the farmers and advised on organic farming. The need for rearing cows in the context of organic farming was also emphasized.
